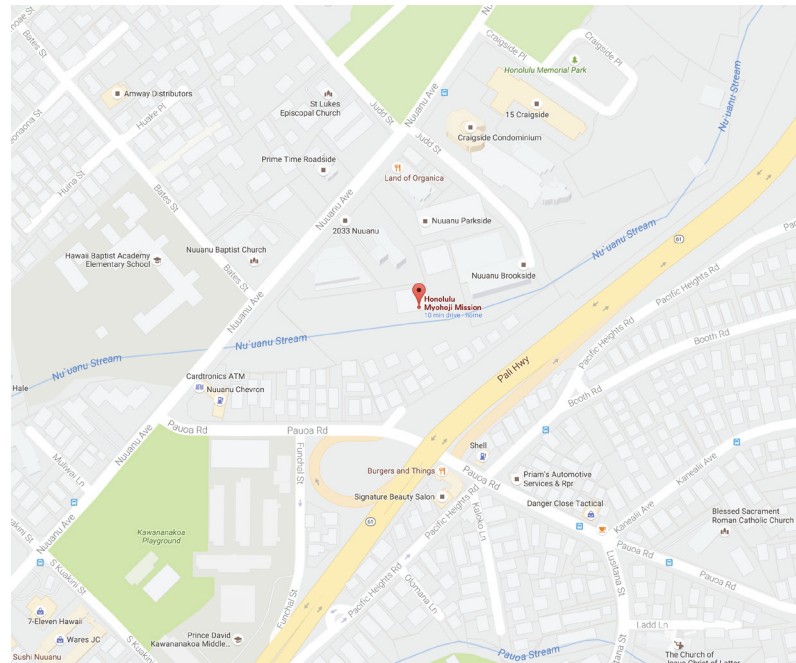

Daimoku (Main Mantra That We Chant):

Namu Myoho Renge Kyo

By reciting the Main Mantra we leave the world of relativity and enter the mind of the Absolute. At that moment, our mind is the Buddha's mind, and our life is the Buddha's life. We are one with the universe.

Doctrine

The Nichiren-shu is a religious order that grounds itself upon the Lotus Sutra, which is the supreme teaching expounded by the historical Shakyamuni Buddha.

We revere St. Nichiren as being the founder of our Order. He read the Lotus Sutra and disseminated it with his very person.

The doctrine of this Order is that guided by the teachings of our founder, who concentrated the spirit of the Lotus Sutra within the Odaimoku, we are encouraged in our faith and practice, and by spreading his teachings, world peace, the happiness of humankind, and in turn individual happiness will come to be. We can confidently believe in such results from his teachings.

Our ideal is to practice the Lotus Sutra, to reveal the reality of all teachings and return them to the Truth of the Wonderful Law, and achieve immediate enlightenment for all of humankind.

Outline of the Nichiren Order

The Nichiren Order appeared in the Kamakura period in medieval Japan. We are a religious order that believes in the teachings of the founder, St. Nichiren, the practitioner of the Lotus Sutra, who devoted his entire life to its practice and teaching. We do so in order to save all the suffering people of this world and to make this world into a peaceful land.

St. Nichiren particularly selected as his fundamental scripture, the Lotus Sutra of the Wonderful Law, from among the many sutras that were expounded by the Shakyamuni Buddha, the Historical Buddha, who is the founder of Buddhism. Moreover, he revered as his original teacher, the Lord Teacher of the Lotus Sutra, the Eternal True Teacher Shakyamuni Buddha, and he stood upon the realization of being the Buddha's messenger, who had been entrusted by the Eternal True Teacher Shakyamuni Buddha to widely transmit the Lotus Sutra, and he practiced its teachings. Accordingly, the Eternal True Teacher Shakyamuni Buddha, the Lotus Sutra and St. Nichiren are the three treasures (Buddha, the Dharma and the Sangha) that followers of the Nichiren Order should believe in.

Honolulu Myohoji's History

Honolulu Myohoji Mission was established in 1930 by Rev. Nisshu Kobayashi of the Kenpon Hokke-Order in Japan.

In May of 1954, the Venerable Rev. Nittatsu Fujii of Nihonzan Myohoji presented the Mission with a Busshari (Buddha's Relics).

In May of 1968, the first Peace Tower in Honolulu, which includes the temple's main prayer hall, was realized.

In 1979, the Honolulu Myohoji was admitted into the Nichiren Order (Nichiren-shu).

In 1983, the Honolulu Myohoji Japanese Cultural Center was built to support the development of Japanese culture.

In 2015, the Honolulu Myohoji celebrated the 85th anniversary of its founding.
